

## DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR YOUR DEFERRED ACTION APPLICATION

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- 1) Birth certificate
- 2) 2 passport-style photos
- 3) Money order for \$465.00 made out to “Department of Homeland Security”
- 4) Passport or other national identification (if you have one)
- 5) Driver’s license or other school ID (if you have it)
- 6) Evidence that you arrived in the United States before age 16:
  - **Copy of your I-94 and visa (if you entered with a visa and you have your I-94, you will not need anything else for item 6)**
  - School records
  - Medical records
  - Mail that came in your name to an address in the United States before age 16
  - Insurance policies
  - Certificates in school
  - Evidence of bank accounts in your name
  - Baptismal certificates, confirmation records, or other proof of your participation in community activities
- 7) Evidence that you have lived continuously in the United States since June 15, 2007, and that you were in the United States on June 15, 2012:
  - School records
  - Medical records
  - Mail that came in your name to an address in the United States before age 16
  - Insurance policies
  - Certificates in school
  - Rental contracts
  - Utility bills in your name
  - Evidence of bank accounts in your name
  - Baptismal certificates, confirmation records, or other proof of your participation in community activities
- 8) If you have graduated from high school or have obtained a GED, a copy of your diploma/certificate of completion
  - 8a) If you have not graduated from high school or obtained your GED, evidence that you are currently enrolled in school at that time you are applying for deferred action:
    - Transcripts
    - Copy of your current schedule
    - Copies of your most recent report cards
    - A notarized letter from your school on letterhead, confirming your enrollment
- 9) Copy of your file from any court before which you have appeared
- 10) **RECOMMENDED:** Results from an FBI check. This is not sent to the government, it is only so that your attorney can determine how to advise you if there are negative factors in your record. If you have had problems with the police or immigration, or are not sure if you have, you should complete an FBI check before sending in your application.

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11) **To fill out the application:** We need you to make a list of ALL the addresses you have lived at in the United States since the first time you arrived here. You need to include every address even if you only lived there a short time. Include the address and the dates you lived there, at least the months and years.
